Copyright and License Policy

Copyright aims to protect the specific way the article has been written to describe an experiment and the results. Copyright explains the rights related to the publication of research. It governs how authors, publishers and the wider general public can use, publish and distribute the articles.

- Copyright on any open access article in a *Journal of AgriSearch* (JAS) published by Society for Upliftment of Rural Economy (SURE) is retained by the society i.e. SURE and author(s).
- Authors grant SURE a license to publish the article and identify itself as the original publisher.
- Authors also grant any third party the right to use the article freely as long as its
 integrity is maintained and its original authors, citation details and publisher are
 identified.
- The <u>Creative Commons Attribution License 4.0</u> formalizes these and other terms and conditions of publishing articles.

Journal author rights

Publishing rights are required by the society to publish and disseminate research articles. This is determined by a publishing agreement between the author and the society i.e. SURE. This agreement deals with the transfer or license of the copyright to SURE and authors retain significant rights to use and share their own published articles. This society supports the need for authors to share, disseminate and maximize the impact of their research.

Rights granted to Journal

For both subscription and open access articles, published in proprietary titles, the society (SURE) is granted the following rights:

- The exclusive right to publish and distribute an article, and to grant rights to others, which includes commercial aspects.
- For open access articles, SURE will apply the relevant third party user license where it publishes the article on its online platforms.
- The right to provide the article in all forms and media so that the article can be used on the latest technology even after publication.

• The authority is empowered to enforce the rights in the article, on behalf of an author, against third parties, for example in the case of plagiarism or copyright infringement.

Protecting author rights
